 Historical Interpretation: Look at books, videos, photographs, pictures and artefacts to find out about the past. Content:	Key Vocabulary:
 Look at objects from the past and use phrases relating to the past and time Have a look at real and images of items from past holidays to the seaside. Discuss Punch and Judy shows and create own. Children to collect postcards from holidays over the half term holiday and compare to those from the past. Understanding of how holidays in the past were different to today. Through looking at bathing costumes appreciate how attitudes to clothing and fashion have changed. Learning different seaside activities and how some are similar and other different to today.
